In 2004, the Ethical Culture Fieldston School celebrates 125 years as one of the nation's leading educational institutions. *From the Classroom to the World* explores the achievements of four American photographers who were irrevocably shaped by their involvement with the Ethical Culture Fieldston School: Lewis Hine, Paul Strand, Doris Ulmann, and Diane Arbus. For each, the school's enduring humanist philosophy, articulated in 1877 by founder Felix Adler, was a touchstone throughout their careers.

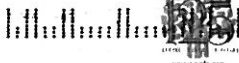
