

ALEF BET: EXPLORING JEWISH TRADITIONS Exploration of four themes of Jewish life—Torah, Hebrew Calligraphy, Passover holiday and the Jewish calendar.

\*ANIMAL CAMOUFLAGE Examination of camouflage principles using a shadow box, model animals, mounted insects and dioramas.

\*THE CITY Introduction of the relationship between the life and form of the city with building models, maps, film and recordings.

ECHOES OF CHINA Exploration of Chinese architecture, art, celebrations, games, geography, history and Chinese-American culture through activities. For individual units see Activity Kits.

\*GROUPING BIRDS Classification of birds according to physical adaptations and behavior using stuffed birds, pictorial data cards, film loops and books.

\*HOUSE OF ANCIENT GREECE Reconstruction of everyday life in ancient Greece through coins, pottery and other artifacts from an actual villa excavation.

\*HOUSES Exploration of the impact of physical environment on living patterns by comparison of Eskimo igloo and Nigerian mud thatch house models.

\*IMAGINATION UNLIMITED Observation and individual interpretation of events with word games, films and unusual objects.

\*INDIANS WHO MET THE PILGRIMS Introduction to traditional and contemporary Wampanoag lifestyles through crafts, artifacts, personal statements and seasonal foods.

\*JAPANESE FAMILY Exploration of family life in modern Japan through role-playing with household items, clothing and family history records. \*MEDIEVAL PEOPLE Enactment of episodes in the life of a medieval manor using character descriptions, costumes and props (falcolnry dear, psaitery, wool carders).

\*MUSICAL SHAPES AND SOUNDS Relationship of the shapes of instruments and the sounds they produce with real instruments, photos and recordings.

\*NETSILIK ESKIMOS Seal hunt similation and exploration of a traditional Eskimo lifestyle with authentic tools, clothing and other artifacts.

NEW ENGLAND INDIAN ASH SPLINT BASKETRY Study of a continuing tradition through slides, tools, baskets and oral histories.

\*PADDLE-TO-THE-SEA Recreation of the story of the Great Lakes trip using replicas of Indian travel materials, French-Indian trade items and maps.

\*PRINTING PRESS Complete production of a book—writing, editing, printing and bindingusing portable press, type fonts, paper, ink and instruction cards.

\*ROCKS Exploration of rock formation process using rock and fossil specimens.

\*SEEDS Experiments with growth and dispersal of seeds including peanuts, beans, fruits and milkweed.

\*WATERPLAY Experiments with water using tubs, vessels, tubes and water systems.

## **Kit Reservations**

Kits are available from the Resource Center on more than 75 topics in the areas of social studies, natural history, physical science, arts and crafts. The kits vary in format from comprehensive curriculum units with structured lesson plans to simple collections of objects and pictures.

Schools, community groups and Museum members in the New England area may reserve and rent kits year round. Kits may be rented for 2 or 3 weeks at fees ranging from \$10 to \$40; long term rentals may also be arranged. Advance reservations are advisable. Kits may be picked up at the Museum's Shipping & Receiving Door (parking is not necessary), or shipped via United Parcel Service, for a nominal fee at the user's expense.
