Read a story about what happened in a family when the grandfather died.

When Ricky and Jessica's grandfather dies, the family has a hard time, even though the death was an "expected" one. Although Mom and Dad are kind and caring parents, there does not seem to be the time or the emotional reserve to cope with all the kids' needs, as well as the friends and relatives, the parents' own grief, and all the arrangements that must be made. Feelings sometimes run high, and the stability and comfortable daily habits of the household are upset. For the children, this is probably the most upsetting and confusing part. Although the things that happen in this story are not all "storybook perfect," this family does manage to share their feelings of loss and grief and to include the children in that process.
