The second exhibit will show what designs and models are possible with LEGO_Bbricks and elements. Everything from Christopher Columbus' Ship Santa Maria to the Space Shuttle Columbia will be displayed, all are a part of a travelling exhibit depicting the development of transportation. The models will be on exhibit through March 1983.
