CHILDREN'S MUSEUM COMPLETES PURCHASE OF MUSEUM WHARF...All documents and transfer of funds have been completed on the Children's Museum purchase of the Museum of Transportation's share of the building...MOT was paid for the cash they had invested in Museum Wharf and Children's Museum has assumed full responsibility for the Industrial Revenue Bonds that underwrite part of the renovation costs on the historic warehouse... Permanent project financing has been underwritten by the Neworld and Mutual Banks...Short term financing of the buy out has been provided by the Brookline Trust and Shawmut Banks...

PHASE II CAMPAIGN TOPS 50%...MORE THAN \$600,000 RAISED SINCE JULY...
A total of \$2,604,000 has been raised toward the \$5 million Phase II
goal to date...Foundations lead in support with \$1,124,000 contributed....
