By working the injured leg throughout the game, Stern limbered up enough to come along and play a vital part in staving off the final Koppy drive.

An additional attraction at the auditorium came in Saturday's game. It could have a bearing on the championship play next weekend.

A pair of Seven Up players, Bernie Struntz and Bill Gullickson, rode down with officials to scout the games. These two, it appears, have been bristling through the season for some deep and unannounced personal reason.

In two separate bouts, each threw at least one good punch. Both left the auditorium swearing not to play if the other did. Arnie Bauer, another 'Seven Up' ace, is reported to be at the fist-tossing stage with another teammate. How it will affect Seven Up tournament play remains to be seen.

Saturday, Koppys opened up a two-goal lead early in the first period. The first score came in just seven seconds, as Dan Gibbons followed Jim Sack in for the count.

The Mustangs got back to a 2-2 split by the end of the first period. Stern scored at 10:02, on a pass from Squeak Swanger. Stern crossed in front of the goal mouth, going away, and flipped the puck into an almost impossible corner for the goal. Dick Weber had the second goal on ganging attack, with assists going to Bud Frick and Stern.

The Mustangs went ahead, 5-2, in the second period. Dale Gray, whose defensive play gets visibly better each game, scored from Frick for the 3-2 edge. Stern hit for his second goal, as he went in with Alley.

Alley hit for the first third of his "bat trick," at 11:35, as the omnipresent Stern bounced in to set up the play.

Joe Borsch got one back for the Koppys, with assists going to Ron Vanelli and Gene Gibbons. Alley matched that one from the Broncs, as he went in with Squeak Swanger, but that was erased by Borsch.

The Broncs held a 6-4 advantage at the end of the second.

The Koppys made it only a 6-5 deficit at 47 seconds of the third.

The Rocket swimming team ended its season by upsetting all predictions and taking third in the Minnesota state swimming meet Saturday held in the university pool at Minneapolis.

The meet was won by Ely with 37 points. Hibbing, last year's champ, took second with 27 and the Rockets had 21.

Two individual swimmers and the two relay teams counted for the locals' points. Points for the races were awarded for the first five, 6-4-3-2-1, while the relay teams were awarded 10-8-6-4-2 for the five placers.

Mike Spock took the only local first by swimming the 100-yd. backstroke in one minute and five and eight-tenths seconds.

Joe Cates placed in both the 50-yard race and fourth in the 100-yard event.

The Rocket 150-yard medley relay team of Buck Scott, Mike Spock and Dave Cutshall took third while the 200-yard free style relay squad of Spock, Cates, Roger Young and Cutshall came in fourth.

Both Cates and Spock are juniors and will be back next year.
